This year's job fair was well attended by employers up and down the valley. We partnered successfully with WorkSource Columbia Basin and Sunnyside

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WorkSource to provide a valuable opportunity for employment networking. At the request of Prosser EDA, WorkSource distributed a survey to participating employers. 23% responded to the survey. With 5 = strongly agree; 1 = disagree the average results were 2.5 pleased with the number of job seekers; 3.5 pleased with qualifications of job seekers; 4.75 pleased with facility, equipment, staff assistance; 4.75 interested in participating in future events; 3.75 overall satisfied. An average of 12 resumes/applications were collected from employers with 13.5 potentially qualified candidates. One employer has hired 4 from the job fair with two other employers indicating they haven't hired yet, but intend to hire.


