
Economy Around Washington State

Labor around the state

- The state's labor force in January 2023 was at 4,029,575
- From January 2022 through January 2023, the state's labor force grew by 29,023
- Resident labor force employment rate is at 94.9%
- Over 203,788 people are actively looking for work

Employment around the state

- The state's nonfarm employment in January 2023 was at 3,548,900
- From Jan. 2022 through Jan. 2023, the state's nonfarm employment grew by 138,400
- Over 152,696 jobs are currently listed by employers on WS-WA






Labor Force around the Region









- The region's nonfarm employment in Jan. 2023 was at 123,800

- Many major industries grew in past year including;



- Retail trade and financial activities remained unchanged








Housing Price Index




Total Population

Median Household Income




Regional Outlook...2023

- ➤ Employment rate of growth may slow down for some industries, but we are still expecting to see employment growth in 2023



Labor Force (Index 2010=1.0)




Unemployment Rate




- The city's covered employment in 2020 was at 3,553

- Many major industries grew in past year including;


- Private Education and Healthcare Services,

Jobs by Worker Educational Attainment



Prosser city, WA had a total population of 6,061 in 2021



Educational Attainment of People 25 years and older




Prosser city, WA had <u>83.2 percent</u> of people 25 years and over with high school diploma




Household Income

 - Population and labor force trends
 - Industry and occupational employment trends and projections
 - Wage and benefit information
 - Career information relating to skills and education
- Data are often available at different geographic levels
 - e.g., State, county, metro area, workforce development region, etc.
